YOUTH HAVE RIGHTS

DISABILITY RIGHTS MAINE has **ADVOCATES** who can help youth like you who are receiving services in the community, the hospital or in a residential program.

An **ADVOCATE** is someone who helps protect your rights.

YOUR RIGHTS. ALL SERVICES.

NO EXCEPTIONS.

- You have the **RIGHT** to contact an **ADVOCATE** if you feel your rights have been violated or you have concerns about your treatment.
- ★ You have the **RIGHT** to be treated with **RESPECT** by staff and peers.
- ★ You have the **RIGHT** to be free from abuse.
- ★ You have the **RIGHT** to not be bullied or mistreated by other residents or staff.
- You have the **RIGHT** to file a grievance if you feel your rights have been violated.
 A grievance is a tool to have your **VOICE** heard.
- ★ If you file a grievance, the staff CANNOT punish you or treat you any differently.

 If you are 14 or older, you have the **RIGHT** to be involved in creating or changing your **TREATMENT PLAN**. This includes talking about your medications, attending team meetings and other treatment options.

RIGHTS IN A HOSPITAL OR RESIDENTIAL SETTING

(Exceptions May Apply - Ask an Advocate)

- ★ You have the **RIGHT** to keep and use your belongings.
- You have the **RIGHT** to be free from unnecessary searches of your body or belongings.
- ★ You have the **RIGHT** to send and receive unopened mail.
- You have the **RIGHT** to have visitors and to make telephone calls during reasonable times.
