VISUAL GESTURAL COMMUNICATION (VGC)

What is VGC?

Visual Gestural Communication (VGC) is a mode of communication that uses gestures, facial expressions, and body language to express and understand information.

Individuals who are unable to communicate using spoken language such as English, or formal signed language like ASL, are often able to communicate more effectively using natural gestures.
